The Faculty of Sciences of the University of Lisbon (FCUL) was created under Decree-Law April 19, in 1911. Since its creation and until 1985, when it was transferred to its new facilities in Campo Grande, the FCUL worked in the building that used to hold the Polytechnic School, and before that, other key cultural and scientific institutes.

The mission of **FCUL** is to expand the limits of scientific and technological knowledge, transfer this knowledge into society and promote the innovation, as well as stimulate a research-based student education.

In Dec.2020, the undergraduate (57%), masters (35%), and doctoral (8%) students in FCUL were 5697, and the staff composed of 169 professors, 159 researchers, and 387 individuals in administration, laboratories, and other technical services. FCUL has a long and successful experience in Mineral Resources education, basic to advanced training. noteworthy are the numerous research projects and the extensive list of innovative contributions on different topics related to Mineral Resources, involving national and international partners, from academy and industry.
